Mandate and the TEC rolling work-plan

- As per activity 11 of the TEC prepared a draft methodology on how to monitor the TNA results, including what such monitoring should include, with a view to showcasing success stories.
- The COP-13 in the Decision 3/CP.13 Annex I, para 8.g. requested the secretariat to
 provide regular updates on progress of the implementation of the results of technology
 needs identified in TNAs, including success stories for consideration by the SBSTA at
 its subsequent sessions, as appropriate.



Inter-sessional work between TEC-14 and TEC-15

- TEC TNA task force tested the proposed option of the monitoring process from
 the background note "Draft methodology on monitoring and evaluation of the
 implementation of technology needs assessment results" presented at the TEC14 meeting, in a selected number of countries in African region.
- The secretariat organized the testing at the TNA training workshop "Moving from Technology Needs to Implementation of Technology Actions" jointly with the UNEP DTU Partnership (UDP) on 27 June 2017 in conjunction with the Africa Carbon Forum 2017 in Cotonou, Benin.
- The TNA task force has drafted TAP monitoring guidance with a view to be embedded into the TEC guidance for preparing a TAP.



Why?

- To enhance experience sharing between countries,
- To enhance national and international awareness of the potential of TNAs and TAPs to upscale technology transfer,
- To improve tracking of implementation of the TAPs and their actions.

Basic information

- It was suggested by stakeholders involved in the TNA process that, after TNA project completion, a system for tracking the status of TAP implementation is established.
- To learn from all types of experiences, tracking of the implementation of TAPs is not only a tracking of the successful implementation but also of TAPs which are still in the process of reaching implementation.
- The information generated through the TAP implementation tracking system will be used to systematically collect and share experiences on how and if countries have been able to attract financial and technical resources for TAP implementation.



Basic information

 The information reported through the TAP tracking system should be presented in a simple table format as a summary with key information on TAP implementation status, to limit the resource implications.

Who reports?

- An effective tracking system may require that one single entity has the overall TAP implementation tracking responsibility, with a designated person for this task.
- The stakeholders being responsible for the activity implementations should then report to the overall TAP tracking entity, or data should be collected by the TAP tracking entity.
- This entity could be the legal entity for the TNA project in which the TNA coordinator is based, it could be the National Designated Entity (NDE) for the development and transfer of technologies, or it could be a third option chosen by the country.

What to report?

Types of information required

TYPE 2 INFORMATION
Initiative(s) Identified
TYPE 3 INFORMATION
Linkages to Other Processes
TYPE 4 INFORMATION
Status or Progress of Initiative(s)
TYPE 5 INFORMATION
Contact and other Available Information
TYPE 6 INFORMATION



How to report?

- 1. The TAP reporting entity will receive a request from the UNFCCC and UDP.
- 2. The TAP reporting entity collects the required information
- The TAP reporting entity fills out the TAP reporting table for each of the TAPs being tracked.
- 4. The TAP reporting entity shares the TAP reporting tables with the UNFCCC and UDP.
- 5. The information reported through the TAP tracking system will be compiled by the UNFCCC and UDP and presented in a simple format, as a summary with key information. The information will be publicly available.

Frequency and possible incentives

- The reporting should be done at regular basis (bi-annually).
- The TAP reporting entity may be invited to events (TNA workshops, TNA side events, etc.) to share their experiences and lessons learned from TAP implementation with other countries and stakeholders.
